



PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Maine Statute 34-B § 6001, The Autism Act of 1984, outlines the Maine Autism Strategic Plan and requires the Departments of Health and Human Services and Education to report out every two years on the progress made in implementing the plan. In preparation for compiling the upcoming biennial report, the Maine Developmental Disabilities Council organized and conducted a summit of stakeholders to discuss the progress to date, recognize highlights, identify continuing challenges, and develop a process for moving forward on the next iteration of the strategic plan and report.
